# " Role Of Settlement Services In Healthcare Access For Refugees

#### What Are Settlement Services?

Settlement services are provided to newcomers to Canada, including refugees. Most settlement services are funded by the federal government through Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). Some services are also funded by Province of BC.

Settlement services include:

- » Information and orientation on living in Canada (i.e. navigating different systems: housing, health, banking, education, employment rights and responsibilities, etc.)
- » Connecting newcomers with community services and resources
- » Facilitating newcomers' connections with local community through hosting / referrals to community events, volunteering, work opportunities, and other information sharing / social networking opportunities
- Providing emotional support and short-term adaptation counselling (non-therapeutic)

# **Types Of Settlement Services**

Settlement services have different levels of support, depending on the complexity of the newcomer's needs.

#### Resettlement Assistance Program (RAP) Counsellors

- Provide immediate and essential services to Government Assisted Refugees (GARs) that are usually needed in the first 4-6 weeks in Canada
- Provide assessment, support, and referral to other services in the first year in Canada

#### **Settlement Workers**

- Provide direct, frontline services to newcomers who do not have significant barriers to integration
- » Assist newcomers with accessing / navigating systems

#### **Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS)**

- » Similar to the responsibilities of Settlement Workers
- » Provide services to newcomer students and their families
- » Services include client-school liaison to facilitate culturally-sensitive communication among school staff, students and families
- » May provide mentoring and leadership development activities and specialized supports for at-risk refugee youths

#### **Settlement Case Managers**

(a.k.a: Guided Pathways Coach)

- » Provide case management support to newcomers who require more support
- » Supervise or guide Settlement Workers in developing and implementing action plans
- » Accompaniments are limited and depend on individual case needs

#### **Enhanced Settlement Workers**

(a.k.a: Moving Ahead Program (MAP) Counsellors, Vulnerable Immigrant Populations Program (VIPP) Counsellors)

- Work with high-needs and high-risk newcomers who have complex barriers that limit their ability to integrate
- Offer individualized, wrap-around support plans outlining a case-managed approach to service delivery
- » Link newcomers to community resources by providing accompaniment, cultural brokerage, and language assistance where appropriate\*

\*Note: Enhanced Settlement Workers are unable to provide interpretation at any medical appointment or situation.
